- Administrators' Report

They can talk to Ms. Denise. We know there will be people moving into the neighborhood and realtors inform her of people moving in and they tell them to get registered with the school. We had a family moving in the area from Dubai and came to tour. They were happy with us within 15 minutes and they saw all the things that they heard and saw about our school. Maggie has been great with organizing tours for those who call up and want a tour. Parents of 3rd to 5th grade, at the beginning of March, we will do another practice STARR test. It is on the platform, the same way the kids log in to the real test. The 5th graders will take science this time. They have multiple answer choices and we want to make sure our students are ready. The students have to do 2 writing responses this time. Mr. Platt has been working with the teachers on the scoring. She wants to thank the PTO so much. The students loved the orchestra. It was so fun and she hopes that it is something we can continue next year. Our partnership with Witz is going great. You must pay to go. We had so many kids to sign up that we were able to offer scholarships. We offered scholarships to some students and they were really appreciative that they were invited to participate. Q - Is Round up for zone kids? A - Yes Q - How did our children do on the test? A -Yes, she loves data and she wants us to know that they saw growth. The rep showed how much time students spent on the test. There is a lot of information in the data. She has a training to learn how to use the data to move the children and she will be using it with the teachers. She always wants to help the children learn and grow. She loves that we are assessing science in 2nd to 5th. She will have more information about the MAPP test results. In 4th and 5th grade, teachers

• Blakeslee - She wants to talk about GT. We tested almost 300 children and it was challenging because HISD kept changing when parents could request testing. The results are just now coming out. Second grade came out Feb. 2. We did wait for the parent reports and we received them on Monday. The GT at Twain use the IB curriculum. The 4th and 5th graders are offered additional course work. She has 11 sessions with those who got the top scores. The purpose of the sessions is to challenge them. She works with them so they are just not getting the answer. She wants to see their work.
